

Violet, 8 1/2" BOM- REQG April,2019

Hello quilters! I am waiting for spring to come, as everyone else in the country! Given the desire for sunshine and warmth, I have decided to choose the Violets that come out in the sunshine! Using a blue violet for the petals, with yellow center and a lime-green background (I used grunge!)

Fabrics:

PALE YELLOW (CENTERS): Cut (4) 2" squares (Snowball technique for corner)

VIOLET (FLOWER PETALS): Cut (8) rectangles 2.5" x 4.5" (4 with yellow center, 4 for flying geese).

YELLOW GREEN BACKGROUND: Cut (8) 2.5" squares.

Directions: 1. Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of YELLOW fabric (4).
2. With right sides together, sew a yellow square on the line to each violet rectangle in the BOTTOM RIGHT HAND CORNER. Trim, and press toward yellow.

3. Sew (4) violet rectangles with (8) background 2.5" yellow-green squares to make four flying geese. Press towards background (green) fabric.



4. Sew each violet-yellow rectangle to each flying geese rectangle positioning the flying geese at the top (flying up).
5. Lay out Violet block following the diagram and sew top row together, pressing seam to left. Sew bottom two squares together, pressing to right.
6. Sew two rows together centering and matching yellow triangles, press and trim to 8.5" block.. Make more than one!.. See you in April, hopefully without the showers!



REQG Board Meeting Minutes

March 11, 2018

Attendance: Martha Johnson, Maggie Stimson, Nancy Frost, Linda Parrish, Bonnie Kavanaugh, Joyce Turner, Susie Freese, Judy DeGraff, Yara Hailey, Terry Tauzer, Melody Williams, Mimi Mace, Pat Smith, Wanda Wahlund, Yvonne Jolley and Jan Phelps.

President: Martha Johnson President Martha Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Martha congratulated the Board and especially Maggie, Nancy, Mimi and Linda Parrish on the success of the Basket Auction. Discussion then ensued about the Auction, as follows: 1) the numbers on the baskets should be larger and clearly displayed; 2) the baskets could be smaller and there could be fewer to make more room on the tables and better visibility; and 3) the receipt number should be written at the top of the bid sheets.

Martha noted that attendance at the Sit and Sew events has been insufficient to cover the cost of the building rental, and asked about continuing the events. There were 12 at the last event and 10 at the prior one and everyone enjoyed themselves. Maggie said these events had been requested by members and the deficits aren't costing much and it's a good activity so we should continue. The Board agreed.

Martha has been coordinating the Quilters' Weekend in Kathy's absence. There are 54 signed up and so it is full. A few people haven't prepaid, as they are required to, and Judy DeGraff volunteered to call them and request their payment by next week.

Set up is covered by volunteers Pat, Maggie, Mimi, Melody and Yvonne. Wanda, Maggie, Melody, Judy and Terry volunteered for clean-up on Sunday. Stitching will stop and clean-up will begin at 2:00 pm on Sunday, with the final drawings at 3:00, after clean-up. Friday will be Green Friday, with everyone wearing green; Saturday will be Crazy Hats and Socks. Scissor-sharpening and massages will be available and Lavender Rose will be the vendor. Many prizes will be available in drawings, including several large ones donated by Susie, and the Prize Master will coordinate this. Barbara Gurney will be asked to be Prize Master. Attendees can earn tickets to put in the raffles by wearing green, crazy hats and socks, cleaning up after themselves and following zero waste guidelines, volunteering for general clean-up, etc. The Zero Waste Master (Yvonne) will oversee clean-up after meals, encouraging attendees to wash their own dishes (attendees are asked to bring their own non-disposable dishes and utensils), minimize waste of disposable items, and dispose of their own waste responsibly. The Key Master will keep and bring all necessary keys and also prepare and bake the potatoes for Friday night, assisted by Yvonne and Maggie. The Kitchen Master will oversee the meals and kitchen work and ask attendees to assist cleaning up after meals.

There will only be one refrigerator available to us, so a minimum of 3-4 large ice chests will be needed, and attendees need to be reminded to bring food for one day at a time so as not to fill the refrigerators. Jan suggested using ice cubes in plastic bags for the ice chests as these are moldable. Linda, Maggie and Joyce will bring large cutting mats. Maggie and Yvonne will each do a demo. As a reminder, at clean-up. Cords and power strips should be bagged together neatly.

Martha said an insufficient number of members (half of the total membership is required) voted on the By-Law change at the March meeting. Therefore, she will e-mail ballots and copies of the changed By-laws to all members and ask for a vote by e-mail. If this is unsuccessful, ballots will be passed out and collected at the April meeting.

Martha ordered "Be Our Guest" cards and will design a larger bookmark.

Secretary: Bonnie Kavanaugh Bonnie asked for approval of the February, 2019 Board Minutes. Mimi Mace moved to approve, seconded by Pat Smith and the Board voted affirmatively.

Treasurer: Linda Parrish Linda reported that the Basket Auction netted \$1921.03, with a bit more turned in at the meeting. She distributed the Profit and Loss Statements for August, 2018-January, 2019.

Community Liaison: Mimi Mace Mimi read a lovely letter from Hospice describing what meaning our quilts have for their patients, especially veterans. She reported the following statistics for the prior meeting: Kits In: 18; Kits Out: 18; Bindings in: 32; Bindings Out: 17. There were also donations of patterns and fabrics. Community Quilts is donating 18 mini jelly rolls and four \$25 gift certificates from Hospice (for use at the Hospice Shop in Arcata) for the Quilters' Weekend raffles.

Small Quilts: Pat Smith We have 140 small quilts in stock currently. The Board ok'd selling them at ticket sales as well as donating to chosen charities. Pat will revise the purpose and scope statement for the Small Quilts project.

Wanda Wahlund: Membership Wanda reported an attendance of 80 at the March meeting.

Opportunity Quilt: Pat Smith Pat is still looking for someone to take over this committee. In the meantime she's forging ahead finding sales venues. She has volunteers to cover the upcoming Logging Conference and a spot at Pierson's. Suggestions for further venues included CCCU (main branch), the Freshwater Guild, and Pony Express Days. Wanda has a tent she can lend for outdoor events.

Quilt Show: Jan Phelps Jan read the publicity script she prepared. It was approved except the address of the church was corrected. Jan will remove local shops from the mailing list of approximately 160 (she'll visit them personally). The Quilt Show mailing will go out by April 1. There are 13 vendors lined up, and Martha (Vendor Chair) will re-contact those we haven't heard from.

Website Committee: Martha Johnson, Yvonne Jolley, Yara Hailey These folks have been meeting with the web designer to revise the website. Martha needs to secure a lockbox to store important website documents. She'll get a quote on updating the Guild logo. Susie will continue to be the contact for the public. She stressed the importance of listing the officers and Board members on both the Membership List and website. Martha said these and other administrative documents will be in a bar at the bottom of the website page as a link. Yara volunteered to be the Webmaster and wants to coordinate the Facebook and Web sites so that each highlights the proper information for its users. She will make a new e-mail address to use as a contact for Susie.

Library: Terry Tauzer Terry is still using the old Library_cart_ since Susie hasn't found a new one yet, but it's working ok with the new storage space.

Martha Johnson adjourned the meeting at 8:10 pm.




Quilt Show Entries

Quilt Show Entry Guidelines

Complete a separate Entry Form, Entry Receipt/Claim Check and Identification Label for each entry.

Attach a 3” by 5” or 4” by 6” color photo of the entry to the bottom right of the Entry Form. Photos are not returned.

Sleeves are required on entries that measure more than 50 inches on a side. See reverse side of this form for directions.

Deliver wearable art on a clothes hanger labeled with the entrant's name and entry title.

Free-form entries must be in a carton or bag labeled with the entrant's name and the title of the entry.

All entries must have an Identification Label. For **quilts**, this must be sewn on the **lower right hand corner of the back**.

Wearable art labels must be sewn on the inside or attached as inconspicuously as possible. Entries with multiple parts must have a label attached to each part.

Due to limited space, REQG reserves the right to limit the number of entries as needed.

All Humboldt County quilt guild members pay no fee for any entry. Non-guild members pay \$3.00 for each entry.

No craft items, rag quilts, whole panel quilts (containing only preprinted fabric panels), tied quilts (except crazy quilts) or quilts previously exhibited at this show will be accepted at this show.

All entries must arrive **clean, undamaged and free of any strong odor**.

Ribbons will be given to the Volunteers Choice and to a Junior quilt.

To claim an entry after the show, turn in the Entry Receipt/Claim Check, take receipt of the entry, and sign the Entry Book. If you are unable to claim your entry, arrange for someone else to do it. They must have the Entry Receipt/Claim Check.

QUILT SALES

All quilts exhibited at the show may be made available for sale by owner by purchasing a For Sale card for a non-refundable \$5.00 fee. Placed on the quilt, the card will provide price and contact information. All transaction details such as sales tax and delivery are the responsibility of the seller. All sold quilts must remain on exhibit throughout the show.

Quilt Sleeve Instructions

1. Measure the width of the quilt and cut a piece of fabric 8½" wide and 1" to 2" shorter than the width of the quilt. Hem the 2 short ends of the fabric (sleeve).
2. Fold the sleeve in half lengthwise with the wrong sides together and stitch the raw edges with a ¼" seam creating a tube (fig.1).
3. Iron the tube flat with the seam line running down the middle (fig.2).
4. Place the tube with the seam line against the back of the quilt and the top just below the binding on the top of the quilt. Whipstitch (or hemstitch) the top of the tube to the back of the quilt, taking care that the stitches do not show on the front of the quilt. (fig.3)
5. Ease the side of the tube facing you towards the top of the quilt about ¼" to ½" (make sure that it does not go over the upper edge). Whipstitch the remaining 3 sides to the back. A crease will form at the lower edge; this allows give when the rod is inserted. (fig. 3)
