National Speaker is Scheduled to Present in May

You don't want to miss the May 7 REQG meeting, nor the workshops scheduled for Friday, May 8 or Saturday, May 9. We have arranged to have Colleen Granger, owner of Sew Little Time Quilting, give a presentation entitled "A Bodacious Trunk Show" based on quilts that appear in her quilt book. Her workshop for Friday is entitled "Simply Charming" and her Saturday workshop is "Rings of Change".

Colleen began her quilting career over 20 years ago in Alaska soon after retiring from the Air Force. She is proud of her service in the military as a helicopter mechanic. Her work as a mechanic enhanced her special awareness which is so critical for her new career as quilter.

Colleen took up quilting while raising her family in Alaska. Within a year of piecing her first quilt, she bought a Gemmill quilting machine and began quilting for others. She got on a roll and hasn't looked back. Colleen has taught quilting classes in Alaska, Arizona and California as well as at Quilt Festival in Houston and Chicago. Colleen offers retreats each year at Duncan Mills on the Russian River.




"Simply Charming" scheduled for Friday, May 8. The pattern uses either a 5" charm pack or a layer cake cut into 5" squares and a background fabric. There are three versions from which to choose. If students are very accurate with their cutting, a second quilt can be completed out of their fabrics.

"Rings of Change" is scheduled for Saturday, May 9. This pattern uses either 18 fat 1/8s, a 2½ "strip pack or a laser cut kit available in either American Made Brand fabrics or Hoffman batik (Available from the speaker). Pieces of the rings are cut using a template. Once the pieces are constructed into a ring, students can begin experimenting on the design wall with

ring placement. Students are encouraged to bring their mobile phones to take pictures of their design options.

April Quilt Challenge: The Right to Vote

REQG is not the only organization celebrating the passage of the 19th amendment to the constitution that granted women the right to vote. The Humboldt's community orchestra will be celebrating by performing selections from only women composers. The Library of Congress is having a year-long exhibit of original papers from suffragettes Susan B. Anthony, Elizabeth Cady Stanton and others. Locally there will be an exhibit at the Clarke Museum on the suffragette movement, and a parade on Saturday, August 22 in Eureka celebrating women's right to vote.

Plus, there is the REQG Quilt Challenge with \$30 prizes for a) the best interpretation of historical, b) best interpretation of contemporary and c) best overall quilt that emphasizes some aspect/concern/issue related to American's right to vote. The quilts for the challenge must meet the following criteria:

Be no bigger than 24" by 24" (maximum of 96" perimeter)

Include one or more works (not part of the fabric) that are embroidered, stenciled, appliqued, etc.

Reflect some aspect of voting (not limited to women's right to vote)

Include a hanging sleeve

Provide a brief description of the inspiration for the quilt, your name, phone number and address on an attached label or index card

Be submitted on or before March 26 to Nancy Frost (443-5264) or Ocean Wave Quilt Shop.

All submitted quilts will be displayed at the monthly meeting on April 2 and voted on by attendees. The challenge quilts will then be exhibited at the League of Women Voters "*State of the Community Luncheon*" on April 24 held at the Adorni Center. This year the League is recognizing one of REQG's own for her many contributions to the community. That person is Wanda Wahlund. (Note: tickets to the luncheon can be purchased for \$65 at REQG's February meeting, bring check or cash. Let's have a big showing of support for Wanda.)

FIVE REQG GRANTS AWARDED

At our January 2nd guild meeting, it was my great pleasure to distribute five quilting-related grants from the REQG Fund at the Humboldt Area Foundation to people representing five worthy causes.

Oceana Madrone received a \$2,000 grant for her Creativity and Recovery Project, which includes both the Healthy Moms Quilt Project, a weekly quilt class within the Outpatient Treatment Program at Healthy Moms, and weekly quilt classes at the Hope Center. Oceana, assisted by Kim Harris, showed two quilts, examples of the work women do in her classes, every block creatively pieced and embellished with symbols of their healing paths.

Maggie Stimson was awarded a \$2,000 grant on behalf of the Redwood Art Association for its Focus on Fiber 2020, a judged exhibition for promoting quilting and fiber arts, taking place from May 13 through June 19, 2020. Maggie, accompanied by April Sproule, one of her Focus on Fiber Committee members, expressed gratitude for the grant because it covers a considerable amount of the project costs.

Mark and Nancy Mitchell received a \$2,000 grant on behalf of the Shelter Cove Arts and Recreation Foundation for its Labor Of Love Quilt Show - September 5, 2020. Director Mark told about the wide range of activities SCARF supports in Shelter Cove. SCARF has had seven successful quilt shows. With this grant they would like to attract more quilters and double the number of quilts. Nancy said they take great care to handle each quilt properly and challenged our guild to enter quilts both individually or as a group.

Malia Matsumoto received a \$2,000 grant for SCRAP Humboldt's Piece by Piece: Textile Tutorials Project. Director Malia described SCRAP's mission to inspire creative reuse and environmentally sustainable behavior by providing educational programs and affordable materials to the community. SCRAP Humboldt operates a donation-based creative reuse store and donation center and a Creative Education Studio, which can hold up to 30 students. The Piece by Piece: Textile Tutorials Project will be taught by SCRAP's Community Outreach Specialist Zena Bardelas in a three-tiered structure: basic sewing, quilting, and creative design.

Susie Freese was awarded a \$1,775 grant for Susie Sews Charity Quilting, through which she does the quilting to enhance the pieced quilts she receives. Susie described how the quilts she has quilted go to individuals and organizations for fundraising, to the seriously ill, and to the needy after disasters.

Thank you, Susie, for your providing stitch rippers as Happy New Year 2020 gifts for all who visited the Raffle Table. Can't have too many of these slippery customers on hand, as they seem to disappear in the quilt room.

During the recipients' presentations, I saw that guild members were enthralled at the different ways REQG funds were to be used, how wide reaching throughout Humboldt County and for the enrichment of our entire community.

The purpose of REQG is to promote the appreciation and knowledge of quilts, sponsor and support quilting activities and educational meetings, and encourage making, collecting, and preserving quilts. Our grants support these goals.

I thank Yara who took photos of the recipients at Thursday's meeting.

Cornered Hearts

BOM for Redwood Empire Quilters Guild February, 2020

Hearts are all around, using scrappy reds and scraps of light/pale background with thin-red lines of texture, for this block of the month for February, 2020. The tip of the hearts are pointing out to the corners of the block. The light patch is placed in the center of the hearts. These four patch sections are sashed with one of the scrappy darker reds, which are in the blocks. Have fun! This was inspired from a heart block of mine of years gone by!

Fabric Cuts/ Colors

Cut (12) 3 ½" squares made from scrappy red prints (think basic red heart color)

Cut (4) 3 ½" squares made from cream background with red texturing, (similar to redwork)

Cut (2) 1 ½" x 6" rectangles for sashing (between the first and second square in row 1 & 2).

Cut (1) 1 ½" x 14" rectangle for middle sashing strip between Row 1 and Row 2

Directions:

Plan your layout so there won't be any 2 red squares touching. Using the 3 red and 1 light/red squares, place into a 4 four-patch section. There are a total of 4 four-patches. When you place these into the block the light square will be towards the center of the block. Refer to the photo...

To sew the four-patch together: Sew Row 1 using the 1 ½" x 6" strip between the two blocks.



President: Martha Johnson

The board decided in closed session to terminate the membership of 2 guild members.

1st Vice President: Pat Smith

Pat asked for project demos for the December general meeting. Yvonne offered to do a demo. There will also be a canned food drive at the December meeting as well as cash donations to benefit the food bank and the breast health project. (which was decided later in this meeting)

Pat brought information about the quilters weekend in March. The Moose lodge would cost \$1,500.00 to rent for Friday afternoon-Sunday. The Moose has plenty of parking and it is heated. The quilting weekend will be on March 20, 21, & 22. Judy made a motion with a second by Joyce to rent the Moose for the weekend with the cost of \$40.00 per person. Motion passed.

Jeanne asked about having a quilting retreat in Willow Creek and she provided several possible dates. After a brief discussion it was decided she will email out the possible dates for further consideration.

Carol submitted a report by email. She reported five applications have been received for REQG-HAF grants. The committee will meet later this month to go over the grant applications. NEW BUSINESS:

The December general meeting will be a potluck.

Susie offered to start hosting the board meetings in her home starting in January. The meeting will return to Monday evening following the general meeting with the next board meeting being Monday, January 6 at 1502 D St Eureka.

The board approved supporting the food bank and the breast health project with guild efforts from the December meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 pm.
