Entry Guidelines

Important Quilt Show Dates:

Saturday, July 31	Entry Forms due with photos and applicable fees (mail to REQG Entries, PO Box 5071, Eureka Ca. 95502)
Saturday, September 11	Deliver quilt show entries to home of Maggie Stimson, 2845 North Street, Eureka (c) 707-496-8807

Thursday, October 7	Set-up and hanging of Quilt Show at Arcata Community Center, 8 AM to 5 PM.
Friday, October 8	Attend Quilt Show at Arcata Community Center, 11 AM to 7 PM.
Saturday, October 9	Attend Quilt Show at Arcata Community Center, 10 AM to 4 PM.
Saturday, October 9	Claiming entries at Arcata Community Center, 4:45 to 5:30 PM.

Quilt Show Entry Guidelines:

- Complete a separate Entry Form, Entry Receipt/Claim Check, and Identification Label for each entry.
- Attach a 3 by 5 or 4 by 6-inch color photo of the entry to the bottom of the Entry Form (Note: Photos are not returned).
- Hanging sleeves are required on quilt entries that measure 49 inches or more in width (See reverse side of this page for directions for making a hanging sleeve).
- All entries must have an Identification Label. The ID label on quilts must be sewn in the lower right-hand corner of the back. ID Labels for wearable art must be sewn on the inside or attached in inconspicuous locations. 3-Dimensional or Free Form items should also have ID labels attached inconspicuously. Entries with multiple parts must have an ID label attached to each piece.
- Deliver wearable art on a clothes hanger labeled with the entrant's name and title of the entry.
- Deliver 3-Dimensional/free form entries in a box or bag labeled with the entrant's name and the title of the entry.
- Members from any of the three Humboldt County Guilds may enter up to three (3) with no fee (Do not count Challenge Quilts in the 3). A fee of \$3.00 is charged for each entry above the three per member maximum.
- Non-guild members are welcome to enter exhibits but must pay \$3.00 per entry.
- The following items will not be accepted at the show: craft items, rag quilts, whole panel quilts (using preprinted fabric panels), tied quilts (except crazy quilts), and quilts previously exhibited at this show.
- All entries must be clean, undamaged, and free from strong odors. The guild reserves the right to return items that do not conform to the standard.
- Entries must be picked up on Saturday between 4:45 and 5:30 PM at the Claiming door near the entrance of the Arcata Community Center. You will be expected to turn in the Entry Receipt/Claiming Check and sign the claiming book before receiving your entry. If you are unable to claim your entry yourself, please arrange with someone else to do so. S/He must have the Entry Receipt/Claim check to pick up the entry.

Sales:

- All entries exhibited at the show may be made available for sale by owner/exhibitor. Owners must purchase a "For Sale" card for a non-refundable \$5.00 fee per sale "entry. The "For Sale" card will be placed on the entry and will indicate the price and contact information. The "For Sale" card will be marked SOLD when the Membership Table in the Lobby is notified by you of a

completed transaction.

- The owner/entrant is responsible for all transaction details such as price negotiations, sale tax, notification of Membership Table, claiming and delivery. Sold Items must remain on exhibit throughout the show and can be claimed by the bearer of the Entry Receipt/Claim Check between 4:45-5:30 PM.

Directions for Making a Hanging Sleeve for a Quilt

- Measure the width of the quilt.
If the quilt width is 49 inches or more, you will need to attach a hanging sleeve.
- Cut a piece of fabric 8 ½ inches wide and 1 to 2 inches shorter than the width of the quilt.
- Hem the two short ends by making a ¼ inch double fold and stitching the folds.

- Fold the fabric in half lengthwise with the wrong sides together and stitch a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam.
You have just created a tube.
- Turn the tube right side out and press the tube flat with the seam line running down the middle.
- Place the tube with the seam line against the quilt backing just below the binding at the top of the quilt. Whipstitch or hemstitch the top of the tube to the back of the quilt, taking care that the stitches do not show on the front of the quilt.
- Ease the side of the tube facing you up towards the binding at the top of the quilt. This will put the fold line you created when you pressed your tube from $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch up from your sewing line. Pin in place and then stitch. When you finish stitching, remove the pins and lay the pressed fold line back down. The fold line will now cover your stitches and allow 'give' when the hanging rod is inserted into the sleeve.)
