March 3rd General Meeting will focus on Yurok Regalia and Basketry

Ever consider who and how local Native Americans make those beautiful baskets that we can view at the Clarke Historical Museum? Yvonne Jolly will share her expertise related to basket making. Prior to retiring from her position at HSU, Yvonne would gather her materials, prepare them, and then weave her baskets. It took at least a year just to cure the materials needed, and then there was the basket weaving.

In addition to basket making Yvonne has also helped make dance regalia for her family members. Regalia is made from deerskin and embellished with clam and abalone shells, pine needles and bear grass, etc. Yurok regalia is similar to that of the Karuk, Tolawa, and Hupa tribes. Yvonne will share what steps she followed in making the dance regalia.

2022 Criss Cross Star Challenge

It's time to step up and out of our shells and get back to quilting. We've come up with a simple challenge that will get you moving in the right direction and hopefully an opportunity to share it in-person with fellow quilters.

Our challenge begins with a Criss-Cross Star block designed by Lori Holt. (For computer savvy quilters search [youtube.com](https://www.youtube.com) for "Sew Your Stash Criss Cross Quilt Block" by Lori Holt to view a 16 minute demo). The star is essentially a Nine Patch block with a slight variation. It is easy to construct. See the layout below and the chart of possible dimensions for your stars.

Our challenge to you is to create a small quilt or wall hanging that includes the following aspects:

- A minimum of 3 crisscross stars of any size
- Fabric selection from your stash or by design
- Perimeter (W+W+L+L) no less than 60 inches and no more than 144 inches
- At least one border that is pieced (non strip border). Constructed borders such as zigzag, piano keys, checkerboard, diamonds to name a few.
- Be turned in by Friday, May 27. The quilts will be shown at the Thursday, June 2 meeting.

I have increased my knowledge of new technical challenges the last couple of years, how about you?



The board has been putting together some fun ideas for REQG. Meeting together, on the horizon, so stay tuned!

Layered Oceanscapes

With Angie Tustison



Hello fellow quilters,

I hope you'll consider joining me for my Layered Oceanscapes workshop. In this workshop, We'll explore the basics of creating an oceanscape art quilt from a photograph. We'll use an enlarged photo as a pattern to create a beautiful picture by layering cotton and synthetic fabrics. You'll learn how to create layered rocks with light and shadow, and how to make the ocean sparkle and shine with sparkle mesh and polyester organza. It's so much fun to watch your oceanscape come alive, layer by layer!

There are two pattern options for the class, "Ocean Waves" (landscape orientation) and "Rocky Beach" (portrait orientation). I will provide students with the enlarged photo of their choice free of charge. Confident quilters can bring their own similar oceanscape photo to work from if desired. I will have optional kits available for \$30. that include all of the fabrics and a few basic supplies. I will also provide a list of materials to those who sign up for the class, and students are welcome to bring and use their own fabrics and supplies if they prefer. I will contact students who sign up by email with details about materials, pattern options and how to purchase the kits. I hope you'll consider joining me, it should be lots of fun!

Humboldt Area Foundation Report

TWO REQG GRANTS AWARDED

On the 6th of January, at our first guild meeting in new year 2022, held via Zoom for safe social distancing reasons due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic and recent rapid spread of the Omicron variant of the virus, it was my great pleasure to introduce and congratulate Sara Kimber representing the Redwood Art Association and Susie Freese of Susie Sews, the two December 2021 recipients of quilting-related grants from the Redwood Empire Quilters Guild Fund at the Humboldt Area Foundation. Each recipient then told the attending members how they planned to make use of our funds.

Sara Kimber, on behalf of the Redwood Art Association, was awarded a \$2,000.00 grant for Redwood Art Association's "A Focus on Fiber 2022" event, a judged exhibition for promoting quilting and fiber arts, to take place from May 18th through June 17th 2022, at the Redwood Art Association Gallery, a setting where fiber art could be viewed and appreciated as fine art. Sara said grant funds would help pay expenses for the venue, judging, and prizes.

Susie Freese was awarded a \$2,000.00 grant for her "Quilting for Charity" project, through which she would continue to provide, free-of-charge, custom longarm-machine quilting of pieced quilt tops received from individuals and organizations for charitable purposes. Susie explained how the quilts go to charities for fundraising raffles, to the ill, and the needy after disasters. Susie would use the grant to buy rolls of batting and bolts of backing fabric.

The following previous years' grant recipients have been given extensions because their projects could not be started or completed within the original time frames due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic and associated Humboldt County Department of Public Health COVID-19 safety measures.

The Eel River Valley Quilt Guild, represented by member Shirley Lipa, was awarded a \$1,000.00 grant in December 2020 for Eel River Valley Quilt Guild's "Katrina's Closet Quilts" project. After Hurricane Katrina's devastation, their guild was inspired to make quilts that could be given to anyone in need, whether because of a disaster or illness or death of a loved one. Previously, quilts have been given to fire victims. The grant money will be used to purchase batting and fabric for quilt backs, so that guild members can make more quilts, ready to be given out to someone in need.

Redwood Adult & Teen Challenge, represented by volunteer Pamela Smith, was awarded a \$2,000.00 grant in December 2020 for her Redwood Adult & Teen Challenge "Sewing Classes" project, through which she and fellow volunteer Jeannie Buerer will continue their endeavor to teach young women basic sewing, mending, and quilting skills. In the program the students gain confidence and in the past have given back to the community by participating in the Relay-for-Life Quilting Marathon or helping set up the REQG Quilt Show. Grant funds may be used to buy another sewing machine or pay for sewing machine parts, repairs, and accessories; fabric and batting; and miscellaneous notions and threads.

Mark Mitchell for the Shelter Cove Arts and Recreation Foundation received a grant for \$2,000.00 in December 2019 for SCARF's "Labor of Love Quilt Show" to be held over the Labor Day weekend. Unfortunately COVID-19's ubiquitous presence has meant putting off the envisioned big event for two years. Mark hopes that SCARF will be able safely to produce an in-person quilt show with classes in 2022.

The use of REQG grant funds in these programs is of benefit to our entire Humboldt County community. The purpose of REQG is to promote the appreciation and knowledge of quilts, sponsor and support quilting activities and educational meetings, and encourage making, collecting, and preserving quilts. Our grants support these goals.

Therefore, given three opportunities to enter quilts, Redwood Art Association's "A Focus on Fiber 2022" exhibition in May-June and Shelter Cove Art and Recreation Foundation's "Labor of Love Quilt Show" over the Labor Day weekend, as well as accepting Lynne and Nancy's Criss Cross Star Guild Challenge for 2022 before the end of May, let's get going and create some quilts!

Happy New Year 2022, everyone! Keep on staying safe! Wishing you merry days of planning, fabric cutting, piecing, and quilting!

January 10, 2022 7:00 p.m.

Meeting called to order at 7:06 pm by Martha Johnson, mission statement read by Shelly Sellers.

1st Vice=President, Nancy Frost - Due to the ongoing pandemic, the board decided that the March retreat will be virtual. Members will be charged \$20 To cover expenses. Angie's workshop may be postponed, she and Catherine will discuss options and report back to the board. The Feb general meeting will have a tools theme, and Yvonne's presentation on regalia will be in March.

Treasurer, Maggie Stimson – Maggie reviewed income and expenses for Dec and the first part of Jan. Maggie no longer wishes to be reimbursed the full amount for a \$99/ yr subscription to Windows 365. She will be using two of the five subscriptions available for her on computers. None of the guild computers are using it right now. She will charge the guild a fraction of the annual fee as their computers make use of the subscription. Catherine made a motion to provide a \$100 prize for Focus on Fiber 2022 for the decided category. There was a 2nd by Susie, motion passed.

Secretary, Angie Tustison – Maggie made a motion to approve the minutes from the 11/8 Board Meeting. There was a 2nd by Nancy, motion passed.

Humboldt Area Foundation, Carol Hansen- The board approved sending an article to the Times Standard about the Jan general meeting, including the announcement of the REQG grant recipients and the program honoring Brenda Glyn-Williams.

REQG HAF Committee Report for Monday 10 January 2022 REQG Executive Board Meeting

-- A special closed, confidential REQG Executive Board meeting was held at 6 PM on Thursday 2 December 2021 via Zoom at which the Board voted to approve grants to two of the three applicants presented by the REQG HAF Committee.

-- Sara Kimber for Redwood Art Association was awarded a \$2,000.00 grant for RAA's "A Focus on Fiber 2022" project.

-- Susie Freese was awarded a \$2,000.00 grant for her "Quilting for Charity" project.

-- Board members suggested a consolation/encouragement letter to the unsuccessful applicant.

-- An envelope containing the meeting's Minutes, from Secretary Angie Tustison, the grant recipient matrix, and cover letter was delivered to the desk clerk at HAF's front door on Monday 6 December 2022.

-- In communications on Monday 13 January 2022, Sydney Marrone, HAF Grants and Scholarships Manager, confirmed names of approved grant recipients and the amounts awarded, and she assured me that she would see that the matter of Susie Freese's unsigned award check would be corrected.

-- A congratulatory letter was sent to each of the grant recipients.

- Having no response to two emails to HAF requesting the full and correct address of the unsuccessful applicant because it was not given on the application, I confirmed the location online and sent a consolation and quilting encouragement letter to that person.
- On Thursday 6 January 2022 at the first REQG meeting of the new year, grant recipients Sara Kimber for Redwood Art Association's "A Focus on Fiber 2022" project and Susie Freese for her "Quilting for Charity" project were introduced and congratulated. Each told the membership how they would be using grant funds.
- Today I spoke with two of three previous grant recipients for whom the Board has voted extending the deadlines for completing their projects to 15 October 2022.
- Pam Smith for Redwood Adult and Teen Challenge's "Sewing Classes" project was awarded a \$2,000.00 grant in December 2020. However, COVID-19 has depleted participants and the classroom would not allow safe separation of students. We agreed that she should use the grant to buy a new sewing machine, repair an older sewing machine, purchase batting from Susie, and more quilting fabric, thread, and notions.
- Mark Mitchell for Shelter Cove Arts and Recreation Foundation was awarded a \$2,000.00 grant in December 2019 for SCARF's "Labor of Love Quilt Show". SCARF did produce a small outdoor-display drive-by quilt show of some 40 quilts in 2021, but not using grant funds, which are being held in reserve to put on a big quilt show this year, hopefully.
- Unable to reach Shirley Lipa for Eel River Valley Quilt Guild's "Katrina's Closet" Quilts project, awarded a \$1,000.00 grant in December 2020.
- November 2021 REQG Fund eStatement:
Ending Fund Balance as of 30 Nov 2021: \$18,128.14
After \$4,000.00 deducted for grants on 31 Dec 2021: \$14,128.14 (approx.)
- If this meets with Board approval, I would like to submit an article to the Times-Standard about last Thursday's REQG meeting: the REQG grant recipients announced, including the program honoring the late former REQG member Brenda Glyn-Williams and showing her fine quilting works, the 2022 REQG Criss Cross Challenge, and what's coming up next month.






