Date to Submit Entry Forms for Quilt Show

Entry Forms for the quilt show must be received by Saturday June 3. The Entry form must be completed but quilters have an additional month to complete their quilts. The Entry Form deadline is 1 ½ months before the quilt show to allow time to enter all the information on the entry form into the computer and print out information cards for each quilt.

Quilters may submit five (5) quilt Entry Forms without paying a fee. In addition, quilters may submit forms for Honor Quilts and challenge quilts and not be charged. Entry Forms and Entry Guidelines are available at the Guild's website. Forms can be found at each of the four quilt shops – Lavender Rose, Ocean Wave, Stitch and Springville Quilt Barn.

Hanging Sleeves are Required For Large Quilts

Any quilt wider than 48+ inches must have a hanging sleeve. The Entry Guidelines includes directions for making hanging sleeves. Some people sew their sleeves on and never intend to remove them, while others use a loose whip stitch and sew on temporary sleeves that can be easily removed after the show.

Commercially made hanging sleeves can be purchased from online sources or from one of the local quilt stores. Call to see which store has them in stock.

Susie Freese has volunteered to help individuals sew their hanging sleeves onto their quilts. Call her at 707-616-6104 to arrange an appointment. Be sure to have your hanging sleeve prepared/purchased before calling.

Volunteers needed To Help with Quilt Show

Guild members are expected to volunteer for at least 6 hours for the guilt show. Those hours can include helping with receiving, loading the trucks with equipment, helping with setup, working at the show in any of the various rooms – Bobbin Bistro (catering), 9 Patch Party, Demonstrations and Bed Turning or the large gym.

There are jobs that involve sitting, others that require standing. We need volunteers in the gym to wear white gloves (we provide) to show visitors the back of quilts. We need volunteers to help sew 9 patches together so that visitors can see how they look on the display wall. We need people to demonstrate a quilting technique. There are plenty of jobs, if everyone steps up and volunteers, we should have a successful show. But it takes all of us to ensure that the show is successful.

If you can't volunteer at the show, help by selling Opportunity Quilt tickets, putting quilt show yard signs in your yard/neighborhood/town, or buying a friend a ticket to attend the show.

Show Attendance

The quilt show is the guild's primary venue for raising money to operate the guild. The guild has some large expenses that it is obligated to pay to keep the guild afloat. Our big-ticket items are facility rentals for meetings, workshops, retreats, and the quilt show, storage unit rentals, liability and fire insurance plus speaker fees, printing costs, etc.

It is critical that we get the word out to family, friends, neighbors about the quilt show to encourage as many people as possible to attend. Our last quilt show had about 900 attendees. We need to increase that number to 1,500 - 2,000 attendees to break even on expenses for the show plus provide money for ongoing guild expenses. So please, invite your family, friends, and neighbors to come to the show.

Thursday, July 13 Layout and set up of guilt racks 9 am to 3 pm

Friday, July 14 Hang quilts. Set up Dining Room, Arts and Craft Room, and Teen Room. Vendors set up their booths 12 am to 5 pm.

Saturday, July 15 Quilt Show at the Arcata Community Center from 10 am to 5 pm. Vendors continue set up from 8 – 10 am.

Sunday, July 16 Quilt Show at the Arcata Community Center from 10 am to 5 pm. Take down begins at 5 pm.

Sunday, July 16 Claim entries at Arcata Community Center between 5:45-6:30 pm.

Quilt Show Entry Guidelines:

Complete a separate Entry Form, Entry Receipt/Claim Check, and Identification Label for each entry – whether they are wearables, 3-D items, quilts, honor or challenge quilts.

Attach a 3 by 5 or 4 by 6-inch color photo of each entry to the bottom of the Entry Form (Note: photos are not returned)

Set Hanging sleeves on all quilts that measure 49 inches or more in width (See back of these guidelines for directions for making a hanging sleeve). Put an Identification Label on each entry. The ID label must be sewn onto the lower right-hand corner of the back of the quilt. ID labels for wearable art, three-dimensional/free form items must be attached in inconspicuous locations with the entrant's name and the title of the entry.

Deliver wearable art on a clothes hanger (label hanger with the entrant's name and the title of the entry).

Deliver 3-dimensional/free form entries in a labeled box or bag

Members of any of the three Humboldt County Guilds may enter up to 5 items with no fee (Do not count Honor or Challenge Quilts in the 5 items). A fee of \$5 is charged for each entry above the 5 items per member maximum.

Non-guild members are welcome to enter quilt items but must pay \$5.00 per item entered.

The following items are not accepted for the show: rag guilts, whole panel quilts (preprinted fabric panels), tied quilts, and quilts previously shown at this show.

All entries must be clean, undamaged, and free from strong odors. The guild reserves the right to return items that do not conform to these standards

Entries must be picked up on Sunday between 5:45 and 6:30 pm at the Claiming door at the side entrance of the Arcata Community Center. A sign will direct you to the claiming area. You will be expected to turn in the Entry Receipt/Claiming Check and sign the claiming book before receiving your entries.

If you are unable to claim your entry, please arrange with someone else to do so. S/he must have the Entry Receipt/Claim Check to pick up your entry.

Offering Your Entries for Sale

All entries may be made available for sale by entrant/exhibitor. A "For Sale" card must be purchased for a non-refundable fee of \$5.00/entry. The "For Sale" card will be placed on the entry and will indicate the price you set and the contact information (your phone number). The "For Sale" card will be marked SOLD when the Membership Table has been notified by you of a completed transaction. SOLD items must remain on exhibit throughout the show.

The entrant/exhibitor is responsible for all transaction details such as price, sales tax, notification of the Membership Table, claiming and delivery of the sold item.

Directions For Making a Hanging Sleeve for a Quilt

A hanging sleeve helps distribute weight of a quilt evenly if it is to be hung. Ideally all quilts should have a hanging sleeve attached to the back top of the quilt. For our quilt show we are asking that any quilt measuring more than 48 inches in width have a hanging sleeve attached to the back of the quilt. Hanging sleeves can match the backing fabric or be a neutral solid. Hanging sleeves can often be purchased at local quilt stores or online. Some people remove the hanging sleeve after showing the quilt, other leave the sleeve on so the recipient of the quilt can hang the quilt if they wish. Make your hanging sleeve by following the directions below:

- 1. Cut a piece of fabric 8 1/2 inches wide and 1 to 2 inches shorter than the width of the quilt.
- 2. Hem the two short ends by making a ¼ inch double fold and stitching the folds.
- Fold the fabric in half lengthwise with the wrong sides together and stitch a ¼ inch seam. You
 have just created a tube.
- 4. Turn the tube right sides out and press the tube flat with the seam running down the middle.
- Place and pin the pressed tube with the seam line against the quilt backing just below the binding at the top of the quilt. Note the tube will end about 1 to 2 inches from either end of the quilt edge.
- Use a blind hem stitch or whip stitch to sew the tube's top fold line to the binding stitch line.
 Remove the pins. Make sure your stitches do not show on the front of your quilt.
- Ease the lower fold line up about 1/2 inch and pin the tube to the backing. Again, use a blind hem stitch or whip stitch to attach the lower half of the tube to the back of your quilt.
- Remove the pins and lay the pressed fold line back down. The fold line will cover the stitches
 and will provide "give" when the hanging rod is inserted into the sleeve.

Redwood Empire Quilters Guild Board Meeting April 10th, 2023 4:00 PM at Maggie Stimson's House

Members present: Maggie Stimson, Amy Gomes, Angie Tustison, Terry Tauzer, Kathy Laforge, Yvonne Jolley, Martha Johnson, Susie Freese, Nancy Frost, Lynne Todoroff, and Jeanine Norrish. Meeting called to order at 4:12 PM by Amy Gomes.

Co-Presidents, Amy Gomes, and Maggie Stimson:

Maggie has an upcoming appointment with John Stroka about the REQG website. She asked the Board about what should be put on the website. Suggestions included the Opportunity Quilt postcard, Quilt Show entry form, lists of library books, officers, and business members, and Quilt Show promotion. Maggie also asked for ideas about things to post on Facebook and Instagram.

Anyone who has ideas about posts for social media or the website should let Maggie know.

1st Vice President, Lynne Todoroff:

The May General Meeting will be the basket auction. Lynne needs people to help supervise tables, log baskets, and rearrange tables after the meeting. Several Board Members volunteered to help. The Weekend Quilt Retreat will be Friday and Saturday, May 5th, and 6th. There are 21 people signed up so far. There is space for 25 total. The Annual Meeting, election of officers and Quilt Show orientation will be in June. There is no General Meeting in July due to the Quilt Show, and August will be a picnic at Freshwater Park and introduction of new officers.

Treasurer, Kathy Laforge:

There was a discussion about ways to reduce the cost of sending mailed newsletters to members who do not have email or Internet access. No action was taken.

Secretary, Angie Tustison:

Martha Johnson made a motion to approve the minutes from the Board Meeting on March 8th, 2023. There was a second by Nancy Frost, and the motion passed.

Quilt Show, Nancy Frost:

The vendor booth spaces are all filled. Everyone is highly encouraged to sign up for volunteer positions at the quilt show, and there will be sign-up sheets at the General Meetings. A photo and article about the most recent Quilt Show Planning Meeting has been sent to the Times Standard.

Community Liaison, Jeanine Norrish:

There was a discussion about whether pillowcases could be included with quilts that are donated to the North Coast Children's Center. Martha suggested that they may be a fun small project for our members. She will give a demonstration on making pillowcases at the Weekend Quilt Retreat. 


