Liaison to Blood Bank Still Needed

The position of Liaison with the Blood Bank is a great job for a member who wants to get involved but not too involved.

The Liaison sends out a call (guild meetings, newsletter, and/or phone) for smaller quilts (wall hangings) three times a year. The Liaison then collects the quilts, writes a cover page to the blood bank indicating the quilt owner's names and the name of the quilt, and delivers the quilts to the Blood Bank. The staff then hangs the quilts. After 3 or 4 month being on display, the staff removes the quilts and is ready to hang the next group.

This committee is a great way to get to know other guild members and see smaller quilts up close and personal.

2024 Challenge Quilt

Here is the grand reveal for the 2024 Challenge quilt...

*Where you live.

Your interpretation, could be your house, neighborhood, county,

country, bathroom, bed, you get the idea.

*Must have a heart.

Any way you want, applique, iron-on, quilted, part of the fabric.

- *Must have the color ♥ green
- *Can be any size, but keep in mind it will show better if it's wall hanging size.

I came up with this idea because I always wanted an excuse to do a quilted


version of my house, now I'll have to.


Block of Month REQG - Due at November Meeting

This simple block can be arranged to produce a dynamic quilt as shown below. The size of the quilt is easily adjustable by adding blocks. The block finishes at 9" x 9" (after being sewn into the quilt), and the quilt shown finishes at 57" x 75" if the 2" inner border and the 4" outer border are used.



Cutting:

Piece A. Cut a 61/2" x 61/2" square. Choose a jewel tone



fabric for piece A. Jewel tones are bright and clear (not pastels, grayed or shaded colors). Many batiks are jewel tone but many prints can also read as jewel tones. If you want to make the quilt shown, cut 30 piece As from the

same or different jewel fabrics.

Piece B. From white or nearly white fabric, cut a piece that is 6½" x 3½".

If you want to make the quilt shown, cut 30 Block Bs from the same or many different "white" fabrics.



Piece C. From white or nearly white fabric, cut a piece that is $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".


If you want to make the quilt shown, cut 30 piece Cs from the same or many different "white" fabrics.



Piece D. From black fabric, cut a piece that is 3½" x 3½".

If you want to make the quilt shown, cut 30 piece Ds from black fabric.

Piecing



Sew a C piece to the right edge of piece A. Press toward A.




Sew a D piece to the right edge of piece B. Press toward D.

If you want to make lots of blocks, you can strip piece the B/D sub-blocks. Cut a 6½" x WOF white strip and a 3½" x WOF black strip. Sew together with black fabric to the right. Press toward black and then cross cut at 3½" into 11 or 12 9½" x 3½" sub-blocks. If you are using fat quarters, cut a 6½" white strip and a 3½" black strip (along the 21" edge). Sew black strip to right edge of white strip. Press toward black strip and cross cut into 5 or 6 9½" x 3½" sub-blocks. The quilt shown needs 30 B/D sub-blocks.

Sew the Block Together

Nesting seams, sew the A/C sub-block to the B/D sub-block with the squares in diagonal corners. Press toward A/C sub-block.



To make the quilt shown, sew six rows of five blocks in each row. The first block has the black square in the lower right, the second block has black square in upper right. Follow this pattern to the end of the row. The second row starts with the black square in the lower left followed by the second block with the black square in the upper left. Repeat the orietation to the end of the row. Rows 3 and 5 are the same as row 1. Rows 4 and 6 are the same as Row 2. I used a 2" inner border and a 4" outer border.



Membership Update

How to avoid scams, phishing, and hacked email accounts.

Please use IT Security measures when contacting members and using membership contact information. Please do not share membership contact information online.

If you receive an unexpected or unusual email that appears to be from a Guild member, first call that member and check to see if they sent that email!


- **DO NOT REPLY to the email and DO NOT FORWARD the email to anyone!** Check the email for obvious misspellings and typos. Check to see if the email is the same as in the contact list. Check to see what time the email was sent. If it was sent at 3:00 AM, that could be suspicious.
- **DO NOT click on any links in the email!** Check the link first! You can check by hovering your mouse over the link to reveal the web address. If the address looks strange or suspicious, don't click on the link.
- **DO NOT share information or links in the email on Social Media (Facebook). Check first!** Before sharing information such as a link to free quilt patterns, or free quilting fabric, or a promotional offer, check to see if the information is factual or too good to be true. Fabric is expensive. It's never really free. If the email requests you share the promotion or context with others, to win free fabric it's most likely a scam.
- Scam Emails often convey a sense of urgency!!! NEVER provide personal information to the email scammer, and definitely don't send them any money! If the email is a scam or what is known as a 'phishing' email, please CALL the affected member and alert them that their email may have been hacked. Please make sure to also notify the REQG Guild Board, such as Tina Fulton, REQG Membership at: (707) 719-2449, or you can call the Co-Presidents Maggie Stimson (707) 496-8807 and Amy Gomes (707) 499-1401.




